



GUEST PARKING


- Due to limited onsite parking at the Austin Central Library, guests are encouraged to carpool and use alternative modes of transportation.
- For those parking at the Central Library's underground garage, the entrance is located on West Ave.

DIRECTIONS TO SPECIAL EVENT CENTER

- From the Central Library's underground parking garage, please take the southernmost elevator (closest to Cesar Chavez St.) from either P1 or P2 to the 1st Floor.
- The Special Event Center is out through the doors to your left when you exit the elevator facing Cesar Chavez St.
- Note: Youth Career Day is a private event and doors will be open for registration as early as 8:00am.

WHAT IS A NETWORKING EVENT?


- Time to meet employers and sale your experience!
 - No, this doesn't mean you *LITERALLY* sale your experience, but you want the employer get a good idea of your qualification such as education, training, and achievements.
- Many like-minded professionals are seeking employment and looking to get noticed by employers so come prepared with a resume.
- This is about making connections! If you don't qualify for a job now be sure to grab business cards for the future
- Strictly PROFESSIONAL!

HOW TO PREPARE?

- Step 1: Come PREPARED to SHINE! (This starts at home)
 - Hygiene (groomed, properly dressed, no over-powering cologne or perfume)
- Looking sharp? Step 2: Resumes! Print as many copies of your resume as possible
 - Remember you will be meeting with over a dozen employers, and you don't want to miss an opportunity. Bring Resumes!
- At the event? Step 3: LISTEN! Yes, you are selling your experience but don't over talk the employer.
 - Be sincere and HONEST! It's okay to ask questions.
- It's your turn to speak? Elevator Pitch Time!
 - Be prepared to speak about your skills and experience in a quick fashion! Practice your elevator pitch. Can you sell the employer in one minute?
 - Networking events move FAST! Remember there's many other people looking for jobs too!
- Utilize the entire space! Walk around and visit all the other tables. Don't put all your eggs in one basket then leave.
 - DON'T hover over employees!



WHAT TO WEAR AT NETWORKING EVENTS & HOW TO STAND OUT



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Why is appearance important?

Conveys a sense of professionalism

Helps make a good impression on business clients or customers

Prevents inappropriate dress in the workplace

Factors such as poor personal hygiene, sloppy appearance, negative outfit choice, and body language all can contribute to a candidate not being hired



What is appropriate attire?

Men:

- Wear a suit
- Dress shirt
- Tie (if appropriate)
- Wear matching socks
- Iron your clothing beforehand

Don't wear workout gear, or hoodies even if they're black



WORKFORCE SOLUTIONS Capital What is appropriate attire?

Women:

- Skirts or dresses should be no shorter than just above the knee. If there's a split at the back, check this will still be respectable even if the skirt/dress rides up a bit
- Check that the length of your skirt or dress is still OK when you sit down, and that the lining doesn't poke out at the bottom
- Estimate how far you'll have to walk and wear shoes that are comfortable enough. If you want to wear high heels, considering bringing a smart pair of flat shoes in your bag as back-up
- Avoid chipped nail polish



Get your outfit together!

Make sure it is crease free and check how you look in front of a full-length mirror.

If you have piercings, keep their decoration discreet

Prepare an outfit that can be adapted for different temperatures. The building you're in could be over heated or have powerful air-con, whatever the weather outside.

In Conclusion

Just remember, in general it's better to be slightly overdressed, rather than underdressed.

If this post still leaves you feeling lost, just think about whether the outfit you're planning is something you would be comfortable wearing in front of your grandmother. It always works for me!

Above all else, you want them to remember your personality, not your outfit. An accessory you wear might draw their attention or be an ice breaker, but they should remember your smiling face and smart conversation.
