The Texas Workforce Commission is **now accepting applications** for the 2022 <u>Child Care Relief Fund!</u> A total of \$3.45 billion is available for eligible child care providers across the state. **Applications will be accepted until May 31, 2022.** 

Eligible providers received an email invitation directing them to the online application portal. Invitations were sent to the email address listed with Child Care Regulation. If you believe you are eligible but cannot find your invitation, check your spam or junk folder or reach out to the technical assistance team for help.


