Accountants and Auditors

Management accountants and internal auditors are watchdogs of efficiency, effectiveness and compliance. Both kinds of accountants can be found in corporations, but each plays a different role. Management accountants study and interpret business numbers, such as earnings and salaries. They decide how money should be spent and advise management on key business decisions. Internal auditors, on the other hand, check that records are accurate and that controls are in place to protect against fraud and waste.

If you are interested in a detail-oriented career helping businesses determine how to efficiently spend and save money, a career as an **accountant** or an **auditor** may be for you.

Management accountants review and analyze a company's financial records. Internal auditors check that these records are accurate and that operations are running smoothly and comply with laws and regulations.
