You're in the hospital recovering from surgery. The surgeon stops by to check on you, and the registered nurse administered postoperative treatments, but it is the licensed vocational nurse who is responsible for your everyday maintenance and care on the road to recovery.

If you are interested in a career helping patients in their day-to-day recovery from surgery, a career as a **licensed vocational nurse** may be for you.

Licensed vocational nurses give patients basic beside care in hospitals, nursing homes, doctors' offices, private homes and other settings. They keep an eye on the health of patients and report their progress to doctors and registered nurses.

Planning, managing and providing therapeutic services, diagnostic services, health informatics, support services and biotechnology research and

development.
