Medical Assistants



Medical assistants are often the backbone of doctors' offices. Some assistants sit at the front desk and check patients in when they arrive for an appointment. Others show patients to the exam room, take histories, prepare them for the doctor's exam, and even assist during the exam. Still other assistants handle insurance forms and referrals or billing.

If you are interested in a career that combines both administrative and healthcare duties, a career as a **medical assistant** may be for you.

Medical assistants keep doctors' offices and clinics running smoothly. Their tasks are often clerical but also involve patient contact and care.

Planning, managing and providing therapeutic services, diagnostic services, health informatics, support services and biotechnology research and

development.

A good communicator who is organized and discreet. Medical assistants are often the first and last person a patient sees in a doctor's office. They also handle personal records and documents for billing and insurance, and must therefore be respectful of patient privacy.

A Day In The Life...

- Record patients' medical history, vital statistics, or information such as test results in medical records.
- Interview patients to obtain medical information and measure their vital signs, weight, and height.
- Set up medical laboratory equipment.
