RNs also work in home care and nursing home settings. Regardless of where they're employed, RNs play a critical role helping doctors take care of patients.

Registered nurses provide patients with direct care and help doctors. They are also health educators who work with individuals and communities to prevent illness and improve people's health.

development.

- Administer medications to patients and monitor for reactions/side effects
- Conduct specified laboratory tests
- Hand items to surgeons during operations
