In fact, in most states firefighters are also certified emergency medical technicians. Life at the fire station is similar to living in a dorm, punctuated by urgent calls to action.

Firefighters work on teams to fight fires in homes, commercial buildings, forests and other places. They also offer assistance when disaster strikes, such as after an earthquake or bombing.
