Sheet Metal Workers

Sheet metal workers have the best of both worlds. They are craftworkers who work in the shops, doing the fine work of laying out, measuring, and cutting sheets of metal. And then they often join construction teams, putting the metal pieces together to make heating, ventilation, and air-conditioning systems in new buildings.

If you are interested in both designing and installing your work, a career as a **sheet metal worker** may be for you.

Sheet metal workers cut and shape sheet metal for heating, air-conditioning, and ventilation systems, as well as outdoor signs, gutters, spouts, and other products using sheet metal. They also install and maintain sheet metal constructions.

Strong, good with your hands, focused, and careful. This is a job where measurements must be exact, so it's important to pay attention to details.

A Day In The Life...

- Convert blueprints into shop drawings to be followed in the construction or assembly of sheet metal products.
- Determine project requirements, such as scope, assembly sequences, or required methods or materials, using blueprints, drawings, or written or verbal instructions.
- Trim, file, grind, deburr, buff, or smooth surfaces, seams, or joints of assembled parts, using hand tools or portable power tools.
