Medical & Clinical Lab Technicians

You place a glass slide under your microscope and adjust the magnification. This specimen contains cells from a patient with a bad sore throat. Your job is to find out if the patient has strep throat. The doctor needs to know because this infection can lead to serious diseases such as pneumonia. Without tests like this one, today's high-quality health care would be impossible.

If you are interested in lab work and analyzing medical specimens, a career as a **medical and clinical lab technician** may be for you.

Medical and clinical lab technicians conduct routine medical laboratory tests and examine body fluids and tissues for the diagnosis, treatment and prevention of disease.

- Work under the supervision of a medical technologist
- Keep accurate, detailed records of your findings
- Wear protective gloves and goggles when working with some specimens
