# Introduction...

The Austin Metro Area Master Community Workforce Plan seeks to bring career awareness of high-skill, high-growth jobs in the Capital area. By gathering information about these opportunities, you can find out which skills and certifications local employers need. This will give you the best chance to find a good job!

We have provided five-year employment growth projections, which takes into account new job creation, as well as job openings due to retirements and people transferring out of a job to take a position in another field. We also included entry-level, median and experienced salaries for these occupations, which shows you how much you can earn throughout your career.

Workforce Solutions Capital Area regularly provides a list of careers currently in high demand along with careers that will be in demand in the future throughout the Capital area. Below is the latest update describing some of the high-skill, high-growth jobs available in our area, and what you must do to qualify for those jobs. If you see an asterisk by a job title, that job is one designated as high need in the Master Community Workforce Plan. Employers are actively searching for people in these positions, but they are having trouble finding qualified workers. Data from the E3 Alliance show that students who enter the workforce directly after graduating high school, but who also never complete a post-secondary degree of any kind, are not likely to be earning a living wage more than 10 years after graduating high school. The occupations listed below generally require more than a high school diploma but less than a four-year degree. Thus, these occupations present a great opportunity for you to explore a career!
